



Central has been a good neighbor for over 150 years, collaborating with civic, business, and nonprofits to address concerns and improve our community. In addition, we work with others to address urgent and emerging needs and issues. We are a vital resource by offering space to meet, perform, and serve. We believe it takes a lifetime to grow a Christian and a Christian community, so we are committed to offering thoughtful faith formation experiences for all ages. Sunday morning Learning for Life classes explore wide-ranging topics. The Bible Story Room, confirmation, Middle and High School Youth groups provide learning experiences for particular developmental stages. Life Groups promote spiritual growth and deepening friendships. Care Partners visit homebound members, and serve Communion regularly. Staff extend caring through hospital, home, care center, and office visits.

Following a rich heritage of ministry to neighbors in need, Central works with mission partners to serve others in Jesus' name. We support our premiere partners, New Genesis Transitional Housing Community and Central Visitation Program, with money, shared spaces and hands-on service. Our reputation as a service provider inspires members and non-

members to volunteer in projects touching the lives of people experiencing homelessness and food insecurity, parents and children, refugees. We plan and staff for two mission trips annually. We provide confidential financial assistance to members experiencing difficulties. Our staff responds to spiritual needs of people experiencing homelessness, and direct them to appropriate social services.
